Chapter -1

1.0 GMDC Ltd & GMDC Science and Research Centre:

Gujarat Mineral Development Corporation Limited (GMDC Ltd), a Government of Gujarat Enterprise, is a pioneer organization in the field of mining of solid fuel (lignite) for more than four decades, catering to the needs of the industries based in Gujarat. GMDC's lignite mining activities are spread over in Kutch, Bharuch, Surat and Bhavnagar districts of the State with a total production of about 10 million tons per annum. The Corporation has also 250 MW lignite based Thermal Power Station at Nani Chher in Kutch.

The demand of lignite is increasing gradually and the corporation is planning to double its production in the next three years. Therefore GMDC Science and Research Centre (GSRC), a research division of GMDC is entrusted the task of obtaining the mandatory clearances for four lignite blocks which are being developed by GMDC Ltd.

1.1 DESCRIPTION OF THE WORK :

The work includes preparation of Feasibility & Geological Report along with approved Mine-plan, preparation of EIA-EMP including TOR, public hearing etc for four lignite blocks.

Chapter No – 2

Instruction to Bidders for Online E-Tendering

2.0 E- tendering online

2.1 THE TENDER & THE OFFER:

It is a two bid system for the qualified and or short-listed bidders who participated in presenting their credibility only. The bid is required to be submitted on line at <https://nprocure.com> by the date and time prescribed in the tender notice as under :

- c. On verification of the supporting documents, the successful bidders will be communicated the date and time of on line opening of price bids by fax or telephone or email or SMS. However, all the bidders will be able to view the price bids online on their computers at their place.

16. Preamble

- 16.1 This tender document is intended to give a general description of nature of the work and the quality envisaged for the material, workmanship and the finished product. It is not intended to cover all minute details. The work shall be executed in accordance with best practices and to the complete satisfaction of the GSRC.
- 16.2 The information given in this tender document is given in good faith and meant to serve as a guide to enable the prospective bidders to submit their offer. It is imperative that the Bidder shall obtain and examine, for himself, all the data, information and particulars required for the satisfactory execution of the work covered under the scope of tender inquiry.
- 16.3 In the event the space provided in the tender forms is insufficient for the required purpose, additional sheets may be added. Each such additional sheet must be numbered consecutively showing the tender number and duly signed. In such cases, reference to the additional sheets must be made in the Tender proposal form.
- 16.4 Price bid will not be opened unless part I & II tender is complete in all respects and party is found to have adequate experience and resources for executing the Work. The price bid of only qualified and successful bidders shall be opened.
- 16.5 The tender document and forms referred to in the tender, if not returned or if returned but not duly filled in and signed, will result in rejection of the tender.

17 Examination

- 17.1 The Bidder shall carefully examine the tender document including all amendments/addendum and corrigendum, if issued, and other details relating to the work and acquaint himself fully with all the conditions and matters therein, which may, in any manner, affect the work and the cost thereof.
- 17.2 The Bidder shall be deemed to have obtained all information as to risks, contingencies, responsibilities and other circumstances which might influence or affect his tender, the progress and performance of the contract and to have taken into account all conditions and matters that may affect his works under this tender and cost thereof.
- 17.3 The Bidder shall be deemed to have attended the presentation meet /pre-bid conference and carefully examined and satisfied himself about the scope and data availability and to have quoted rates, taking into consideration all such conditions and matters, which may, in any manner, affect the work and the cost thereof.
- 17.4 The Bidder shall be deemed to have acquainted himself with all Government, and Labour laws, statutes, regulations, rules or notifications relating to taxes, levies and

other charges relating to the work or otherwise as applicable from time to time.

- 17.5 Any neglect or omission or failure on the part of the Bidder in obtaining necessary and reliable information upon the foregoing or any other matter affecting the tender, shall not absolve him of any risk or liabilities or responsibilities for completion of the entire work in accordance with the terms and conditions of the tender document.
- 17.6 Any conditional tender will be rejected outright and no claim whatsoever in respect thereof shall be entertained. The Management of GSRC reserves the right to reject / cancel any or all tenders without assigning reasons and to negotiate with any Bidder for more favourable rates

Each and every page of the tender proposal shall be signed by the Bidder with his usual signature. All signatures should be dated and Company's seal shall be affixed below it.

- 18 **Goods & Service tax** : GST if applicable, will be paid/adjusted/reimbursed to the Successful bidder as per the prevailing rates subject to production of documentary proof and Successful bidder will mention the GST amount separately in the invoice/bill after considering the abatement, if any.
- 19 **Validity of the offer:**
The bidders agrees that the rate submitted shall remain valid for acceptance for a period of 180 days from the date of the opening of the tender.

Chapter No - 3

Other important instruction to bidders

1 Data-collection:

GSRC will provide bore hole information about seam thickness, its quality along with location plans, cadastral plans etc. past exploration report having relevant data of the block in raw form will be provided. The successful bidder has to prepare Geological Reports&Feasibility with requisite software and a detailed mine plan for the excavation for the production target indicated in the scope of work dealt in detail in chapter-5 including progressive mine closure and final closure which is to be submitted to MoC, IBM as the case may be. Environment Impact Assessment as per terms of reference (TOR) and submission of Management Plans in an acceptable format by MoEF.

The successful bidder has to make his own arrangement for data collection and site visits required for detailed planning required by regulatory authorities.

2 Rate quotation of work

- a). The Bidder has to quote separate/individual rate for the preparation of Feasibility&Geological Report, mine plan for approval and preparation of EIA-EMP report including TOR in INR as lumpsum separately as given in price bids.

The bidder shall quote rates as lumpsum for each report and applicable GST separately as per format of price bid.

GST, if applicable and payable by the successful bidder, shall be reimbursed by GSRC at actual subject to submission of documentary proof of having remitted / adjusted the GST and to the extent directly related to the services rendered by the successful bidder under the contract. This shall be subject to submission of documentary proof clearly mentioning the name of work and respective RA Bill No.

Any other fresh imposition or variation in existing taxes or levies during the currency of the contract by the Govt. if applicable and payable by the contractor shall be reimbursable by GSRC at actual subject to submission of documentary proof having remitted/adjusted the same and to the extent directly related to services rendered by the contractor under this contract.

- b). The evaluation of offers will be made on the basis of technical capability and the lowest offer received for the entire work.
- c). The GSRC reserves the right to accept or overlook or reject any lower offer and / or split the work between more than one bidders without assigning any reason thereof .
- d). The bidder is required to quote the rate strictly as per the terms and conditions mentioned in the tender documents. **The conditional tender will not be entertained and will be rejected summarily.**

3. ACCEPTANCE OF LETTER OF INTENT :

If the successful bidder does not accept the Letter of Intent issued by GSRC within two weeks from the date of its receipt, the amount of the EMD paid by him will be forfeited.

4. COMMENCEMENT OF WORK & MILESTONES TO BE ACHIEVED:

The successful bidder will have to start the work within 30 (Thirty) days from the date of receipt of the Letter of Intent, by deploying adequate man-power with required software to carry out the job and will have to submit draft documents for geological reports along with feasibility within four months thereafter. Subsequently Draft Mine-plan also to be prepared and submitted within four months to regulatory /approving authorities like Ministry of Coal and Indian Bureau of Mines in soft copy as well as hard copies as the case may be. Preparation of EIA-EMP after obtaining TOR and submission to authorities like MOEF will have to be completed within a period of four months with one season monitoring or one year for three seasons monitoring..

In case of failure to commence the work within 45 days from the date of receipt of the LOI or in failure to achieve the targets as scheduled above, the contract may be terminated, at the discretion of GSRC forfeiting EMD

5 CONTRACT AGREEMENT:

The successful bidder will have to enter into an agreement within 15 (Fifteen) days from the date of the receipt of LOI, with GSRC on appropriate Stamp Paper (to be provided by the Contractor) in token of acceptance of the terms and conditions of the contract. In case of failure, the contract is liable to be terminated and the Security deposit may be forfeited.

The successful bidder shall also indemnify GSRC against any claim, compensation, damage, loss, penalty etc. for breach and / or non-fulfillment of the prevailing Rules and Regulations and other statutory provisions in force from time to time and applicable to the work during the currency of contract

6. GENERAL:

- a) GSRC will not be responsible for any postal delay whatsoever.
- b) If the tender documents and forms referred to in the offer are not submitted or are submitted but not found duly filled in and unsigned, will result in rejection.
- a) In the event of space being insufficient for furnishing required information, additional sheets may be used and signed.
- b) Canvassing in any form may lead to rejection of the offer.

7. GSRC reserves the right to reject any or all the offer or split the work between more than one bidder without assigning any reason thereof.

**Chapter - 4.
Qualifying Criteria**

1.1 Experience :The bidder should have following minimum experience of having successfully completed similar work during the last 3 years and the weight age will be given as per the following table. However, for the qualification to enter into the next round of price-bid, minimum 50 points are required for getting qualified in the preliminary bid. Hence supporting document to be submitted along with the tender document duly filled-in and signed for all the criteria enumerated in the table below.

Minimum 50 points is mandatory for qualifying/participating in the price-bid.

1.2 Possession of soft-wares like DataMine/Surpac

Minimum 1 no having any of the above software. Bidder has to submit documentary evidence clarifying ownership/authorised user-ship along with preliminary bid .

2. Qualifying Criteria for Environment Clearance:

(i) Bidders must be accredited by QCI-NABET in Opencast Mining under category “A” and Project activity under Sector 1 (Mining of minerals including Opencast/Underground mining). Bidders have to provide copy of Letter/Certificate from NABET showing their valid accreditation.

(ii) Bidder must have at least 10 years of coal mining EC Clearance experience, since the last date of receipt of this e-Tender.

(iii) Bidder must have achieved Environment Clearance of at least 3 coal mining

projects (ongoing project will not be considered) from Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change, GoI- New Delhi.

(iv) Bidder must have its own laboratory approved by NABL and MOEFCC both and copies of valid certificate should be submitted with bid.

3. Technical employees

Minimum six Technical people like Geologist having MSc/M.Tech degree, Mining Engineers having B.E/B.Tech, Experienced RQPs/TQPs along with Environmental Engineer and Surveyors. Bidder has to submit documentary evidence clarifying employment details of all the persons listed above along with preliminary bid

4. Average Annual turnover of the company in the last three years

Bidder has to submit copy of the audited balance sheet of last three years along with preliminary bid. The bidder must have sound financial position of doing business with a turnover of about 50 Lacs per year or so to deploy additional manpower so as to meet the targets. A certified copy of the balance sheet for the last three years must be attached with the preliminary bid.

5. Alternatively, the bidder may produce an original copy of the agreement signed with some other individual(s) / party(ies) forming a Joint Venture Company, who would carry out the contract and the JVC parties should jointly own the responsibility to complete the contract work .
6. The bidder should clearly state its status and submit duly attested supporting documents

7. Joint Venture:

In case of joint venture the bidder shall specify the name & area of operation of all partners of a joint venture as follows:

Lead partner , Partner-1, Partner-2

A joint venture company may undertake the contract. Each member / entity of the joint venture company will be responsible for completing the task as per the contract. Joint Venture Company shall comply with the following:

- i). Documentary evidence of formation of the joint venture company in the form of legal document must be included with the bid.
- ii) The bid shall include all the information regarding capability, experience as required for a bidder for each partner. For the purpose of eligibility criteria, credentials of the

members of a joint venture company will be considered collectively.

- iii) A party can be a member in only one Joint Venture company. Bids submitted by other Joint Venture companies including the same party as member will be rejected.
- iv) Separate bid by a member of a Joint Venture company will not be accepted.
- v) The JV Agreement must include the relationship between joint venture partners in the form of JV Agreement to legally bind all partners jointly and severally for the proposed agreement which should set out the principles for the constitution, operation, responsibilities regarding work and financial arrangements, participation (percentage share in the total) and liabilities (joint and several) in respect of each and all of the firms in the joint venture. Such JV Agreement must evidence the commitment of the parties to bid for the facilities applied for (if pre-qualified) and to execute the contract for the facilities if their bid is successful.
- vi). One of the partners responsible for performing a key component of the contract shall be designated as Lead Partner. This authorization shall be evidenced by a Power of Attorney signed by legally authorized signatories of all the partners.
- vii). The JV Agreement must provide that the Lead Partner shall be authorized to incur liabilities and receive instructions for and on behalf of any and all partners of the Joint Venture and the entire execution of the contract shall be done with active participation of the Lead Partner.
- viii).The contract agreement should be signed jointly by each Joint Venture Partners.
- ix). The J.V. agreement may specify the share of each individual partner for the purpose of execution of this contract. This is required only for the sole purpose of apportioning the value of the contract to that extent to individual partner for subsequent submission in other bids if he intends to do so for the purpose of the qualification in that tender.
- x). Joint venture company can utilize the digital key of any one partner for online submission of the e-tender.
- xi).The successful bidder, if having joint venture firm or entity shall not change its formation, constitution, or construction without prior approval of the GSRC.

8 ACCEPTANCE OF GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

The bidder should unconditionally accept all the terms and conditions of the contract by signing on each page of the preliminary bid document of the tender including annexure.

9 EMD

The bidder should enclose separate crossed demand draft in favour of Corporation payable at Ahmedabad from GoG approved banks only worth Rs. 2 lacs (Rupees Two lacs) towards Earnest Money Deposit along with the documents of preliminary bid in the cover so super-scribed. In absence of the DD for EMD or inadequate amount of EMD, the offer will be rejected.

10 DECLARATION

The bidder should give a declaration along with the preliminary bid that it has not enclosed any conditional offer.

11 BLACK-LISTING OF THE BIDDER:

The Bidder or its directors or partners of JVC should have been not black listed by any Government organization, nor should any litigation should be pending against any of them. The bidder will submit declaration to this effect along with the preliminary bid. If at any time such declaration is found false, the bid will be rejected or if the contract work is already awarded, it will be terminated forthwith without payment of any compensation and the EMD/SD will be forfeited.

6. Cadastral plan having khasra numbers
7. Litho-logs of the drilled boreholes.
8. Cross and L sections
9. Lignite / limestone to Overburden ratio contour map
10. Lignite / limestone thickness contour map(iso-pachytes)
11. Lignite Floor contours (top as well as bottom of seam)
12. Reserve Calculation as per UNFC and related map

The successful bidder has to submit final Geological & Feasibility Report within four months after data supplied by GSRC.

GSRC responsibility: To provide basic drill-hole data required for report preparation.

1.2 Preparation of Mine-plan as per the guidelines issued by MoC (dt.4-4-2011) & IBM from time to time:

Statutes/Acts and Rules to be considered for Mining proposals/methods: CMR,1957, MCDR,1988, MMRD,1957, Safety related circulars issued by DGMS along with Acts promulgated and their amendments from time to time. Minerals (Evidence of Mineral contents) Rules,2015 may be considered for limestone mining considering threshold value.

The Mine-plan shall be prepared to exploit the available mineral reserves of the area by opencast methods to ensure mineral conservation. Latest software have to deployed for detailed planning.

- (xxvi) Successful Bidder will be overall responsible for the grant of Environment Clearance from Ministry of Environment, Forests & Climate Change, GoI – New Delhi from the preparation and submission of application for ToR till the grant of EC as per the guidelines of ToR, EIA Notification 2006 and further amendments thereof and other MOEFCC / GPCB guidelines.
- (xxvii) Successful Bidder shall assist GSRC in defending on all aspects pertaining to these projects with statutory agencies and will attend all scheduled meetings.
- (xxviii) Only NABET Qualified Person shall be engaged during EIA-EMP preparation as well as all the various presentations in MOEFCC. It is also compulsory that the same NABET qualified persons should be depute for the presentations in MOEFCC for EC Appraisal, who were involved in preparation of EIA-EMP report of the these projects or aware with these project and EIA-EMP.
- (xxix) In case of expiry of validity of NABET Accreditation, Bidder shall be responsible to complete the work on their cost as well as risks and GSRC will not bear any expenses in such incidence.

2.0 General scope of Services :

The successful bidder shall deploy his own manpower for the preparation of Feasibility & Geological Report, Approved Mine-plan along with Environmental clearance for which obtaining terms of reference from MoEF and study, collect data and prepare EIA-EMP reports which are acceptable by MoEF upto the satisfactory completion of the entire scope of work yielding the clearance certificate.

The successful bidder shall make his own arrangement to accomplish the task at his own cost.

The successful bidder shall make his own arrangement for site visit for the collection of data and also for planning purpose

The contract shall be awarded on turnkey basis and there shall be no subletting of any job.

3 DURATION AND QUANTITY OF WORK

- (a) The period required for the preparation of Feasibility & Geological Report will be of four months from the date of LOI
- (b) The time period considered for the preparation of Mine-plan incorporating the guidelines for progressive mine-closure as well as Final mine-closure as per the guidelines of Ministry of Coal and as per guidelines of IBM will be of four months after the submission of GR & Feasibility.
- (c) Two of the lignite blocks also contain limestone as over-burden. The target has been fixed roughly to achieve both the quantities of lignite and limestone based on the selection criteria for mining and dumping.
- (d) The time period considered for the preparation of EIA-EMP reports as spelt in TOR as per the guidelines specified by MoEF is four months for one season monitoring and three/four seasons monitoring may take about an year including public hearing etc.

However GSRC reserves the right to increase or decrease the quantum of the work with advance intimation to the Successful Bidder. GSRC reserves the right to split the work between more than one bidders without assigning any reason thereof.

4. RATES:

- (a) The Bidder has to quote individual /separate rate for (1) the preparation of Feasibility & Geological Report in INR as lump-sum. (2) Also for the rate separately for the preparation of Mining Plan as per guidelines issued by MoC & IBM from time to time. (3) In the same manner a lump-sum rate may also be quoted for detailed EIA-EMP reports to be prepared in an acceptable content and format by MoEF. The price-bid has three components in which all the three works pertaining to GR, Mine-plan and EIA-EMP has to be executed by a single commercial entity (JV permissible) for each block. The rates for the three items/works for one particular block can not be undertaken/ executed by two bidders partially except that they form a JV between them.

The contractor has to quote rates for the above three reports and applicable GST separately as per the format of the price bid.

- (b) Rate quoted shall remain valid for 180 days from the date of opening of the technical bid, which shall have to be extended unconditionally for further maximum of period 60 days, as deemed fit by GSRC
- (c) The firm rate quoted by the successful bidder shall be valid for the entire currency of the contract. No escalation in the rates will be allowed on any ground whatsoever in nature.

5 EARNEST MONEY DEPOSIT :

6 SECURITY DEPOSIT

- ii) 25% of the amount quoted will be released after submission of Draft Mine-plan to regulatory authorities with a copy to GSRC which is acceptable wherein the required changes have to be incorporated to meet the requirement of regulatory agencies.
- iii) 25% of the amount quoted will be released after submission of EIA-EMP to MoEF with a copy to GSRC which is acceptable wherein the required changes have to be incorporated to meet the requirement of regulatory agencies.
- iv) 25% of the amount quoted will be released after the receipt of requisite clearances from regulatory authorities like MoC , IBM & MoEF

8. MODE OF PAYMENT

The Running Account bills, submitted at GSRC Office will be processed, after considering following deductions.

- a) Income tax as per provision of Income Tax Act, and other Taxes (and sur-charges) applicable in force from time to time
- b) Security Deposit @ 5% of the gross amount of the RA bill
- c) If any amount becomes payable by as a result of any claim or application in terms of the provisions or non compliance of provision of the any Acts and the Rules and Regulations, By-laws or the Orders made there under, applicable from time to time , such amounts shall be recoverable from the tenderer for which GSRC will not be responsible for any compensation
- d) Any other applicable deduction.

9 LOCAL FACILITIES / LOCAL CONDITIONS

- a) GSRC do not undertake and agree to provide any facilities to the successful bidder. However, the Successful bidder have to make his own independent arrangements.

10 STATUTORY OBLIGATIONS:

- a) The successful bidder shall be responsible for engaging requisite manpower, and shall also fulfill the provisions of Labour laws, Contract Labour Laws etc if applicable
- b) If any amount becomes payable by GSRC as a result of any claim or application in terms of the provisions or non compliance of provision of the any Acts and the Rules and Regulations, By-laws or the Orders made there under, applicable from time to time , such amounts shall be recoverable from the Successful Bidder for which GSRC will not be responsible for any compensation.
- c) The Successful Bidder shall also indemnify the GSRC against any claims, compensations, damages, loss, penalty etc. for breach and / or non-fulfillment of the prevailing Rules and Regulations and other statutory provisions in force from time to time and applicable to the work during the currency of contract.

11 MEASUREMENTS

- 1) Out-put in terms of preparation and submission of Feasibility & Geological Reports in four months time. After incorporating all the requisite changes suggested and submission of final GR to GSRC will be first milestone for which 25% of the quoted amount will be released.
- 2) Out-put in terms of Mine-plan prepared and submitted to regulatory authorities like MoC, IBM in hard &/soft copies as the case may be for which 25% of the quoted amount will be released.
- 3) Out-put in terms of EIA-EMP according to the terms of reference by MoEF has to be prepared and submitted to them with a copy to GSRC for which 25% of the quoted amount will be released
- 4) Clearances /approval letters from MoC &/IBM & MoEF as the case may be for which 25% of the quoted amount will be released.

12 LIQUIDATED DAMAGES(L.D.)

1. If the successful bidder fails to start the work within (30) days of receipt of LOI, liquidated damage @ Rs. 5000/- per day shall be leviable, for a maximum period of 15 days. If the bidder fails to start work even after 15 days, the GMDC will be free to take any action including forfeiting of EMD and termination of LOI at the cost and risk of the contractor.

- 14.1 If the Successful bidder fails to carry out the work as per terms and conditions of the contract to the satisfaction of the GSRC, GSRC shall be entitled to forfeit the security deposit paid by the Successful bidder. This however, shall not absolve the Successful bidder from his obligation to fulfill the contract. In such event, the GSRC shall have a right to complete and / or to get the work completed at the cost & risk of the Successful bidder and the Successful bidder shall be responsible to pay such cost incurred by the GSRC to complete the work and / or to get the work completed.
- 14.2 Likewise, if the Successful bidder does not fulfill the terms and conditions of the contract and does not carry out the work up to the entire satisfaction of GSRC, GSRC has the right to forthwith terminate the contract at its sole discretion, without assigning any reason, Under such events, the GSRC shall be entitled to forfeit the security deposit paid by the Successful bidder and the GSRC shall have a right to complete the work and / or to get the work completed at the risk and cost of the Successful bidder.

15 ARBITRATION

The language of the Arbitration shall be English.

16 JURISDCITION

Matter relating to any dispute or differences arising out of this Tender and subsequent contract based on the bid shall be subject to the exclusive jurisdiction of Courts at Ahmedabad only.

17 FORCE MAJEURE

17.1 Force majeure is herein defined as any cause which is beyond the control of the Successful bidder or the GSRC as the case may be which they could not foresee or with a reasonable amount of diligence could not have foreseen and which substantially affect the performance of the contract, such as:

- i. natural phenomena such as flood, draughts Cyclone, earthquake and epidemics, declaration of war.
- ii. Acts of any government, including but not limited to war, declared or undeclared priorities, quantities, embargoes, providing either party shall within fifteen (15) days from the occurrence of such a cause notify the other in writing of such cases.

17.2 The Successful bidder will advise, in the event of his having resort to this clause by a registered letter duly certified by the statutory authorities, the beginning and end of the cause of delay, within fifteen days of the occurrence and cessation of such Force Majeure condition. In the event of delay lasting over two months, if arising out of Force Majeure, the contract may be terminated at the discretion of the GMDC.

17.3 For delay arising out of Force Majeure, the Successful bidder will not claim extension in completion date for a period exceeding the period of delay attributable to the causes of force Majeure and neither company nor he Successful bidder shall be liable to pay extra costs (like increase in rates, remobilization, advance, idle charges for labour and machinery etc.) provided it is mutually established that the Force Majeure conditions

did actually exist.

If any of the Force Majeure conditions exists in the place of operation of the Successful bidder even at the time of submission of bid he will categorically specify them in his bid and state whether they have been taken into consideration in their quotations

- 17.4 The Successful bidder of the GSRC shall not be liable for delays in performing his obligations resulting from any force majeure cause as referred to and/ or defined above. The date of completion will, subject to hereinafter provided, be extended by a reasonable time given though such cause any occur after Successful bidder's performance of his obligations has been delayed for other causes.

18 TERMINATION OF THE CONTRACT

GSRC may terminate this contract at any time during by giving seven days notice to the Successful bidder without assigning any reason whatsoever.

In case of any changes in the directives of Central/State Government regarding mining operation / and execution of work related thereto, the same shall have to be strictly adhered to and binding upon Bidder/ Successful bidder for implementation and GSRC will not be responsible for any losses suffered by the successful Bidder as a result of such changes
