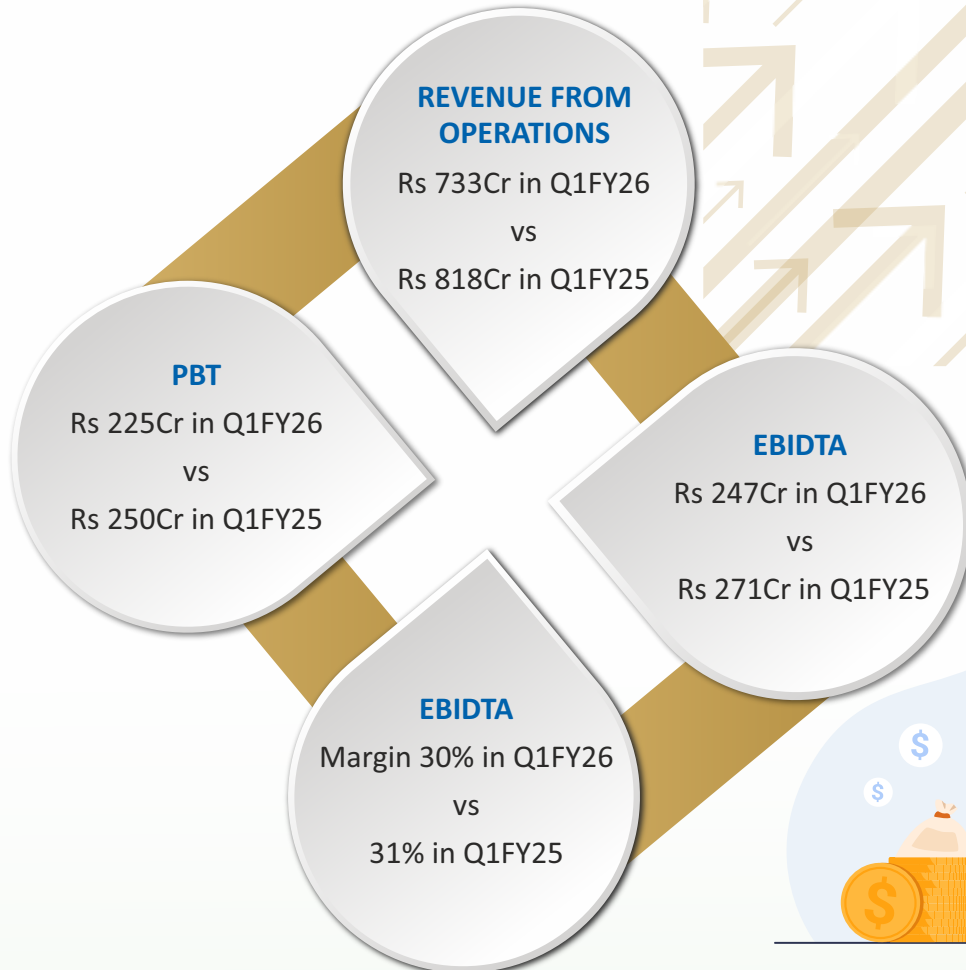

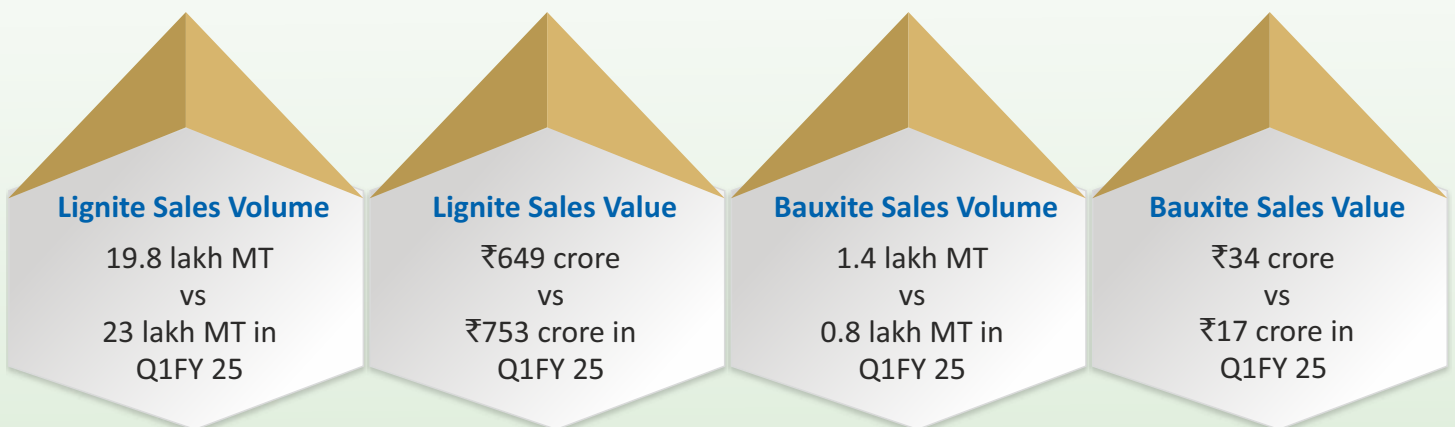

## Our Commitment for Sustainability

### GMDC's Mines Recognised Under IBM's Five Star Rating Framework

In alignment with national goals for sustainable and responsible mining, Gujarat Mineral Development Corporation Ltd. (GMDC) has been conferred with the Five Star Rating Award for four of its bauxite mining leases (Nana Goniysar, Daban, Roha-Kotda, Mewasa) under the Indian Bureau of Mines (IBM) assessment for FY 2023–24.

The award, instituted by the Ministry of Mines, Government of India, was presented on 7th July 2025 in Jaipur, as part of IBM's annual recognition programme to promote environmental safeguards and socio-economic performance in mining.
